CALLS FOR SERVICE BILLING WORKGROUPS



Drugs Includes trafficking, production, and importation of drugs including marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substances. It also includes occurrences related to indoor/outdoor grow labs.

Drug Possession Includes all occurrences where the most serious violation is possession of marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substance. It also includes other minor drug related offences.

Operational calls for service are non-criminal events that police attend to. These include animal complaints, non-criminal domestic disturbances, missing persons, noise complaints, property – lost or found, sudden deaths, and assist public calls.

Operational 2 Includes false alarms, keep the peace and 911 calls/911 hang-ups. Due to the higher frequency of these calls, they have been separated out from the 'Operational' category and allocated a lower time standard. Traffic incidents are excluded.

Other Criminal Code Violations The majority of offences counted in the Other Criminal Code Offences group are criminal offences that are not directed to people or related to property. It is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Other Criminal Code'. These include prostitution, offensive weapons, bail violations, counterfeiting, disturb the peace, indecent acts, breach of probation, and bribery.

Property Crime Violations This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Property Crimes'. These include arson, break and enter, theft, possession of stolen goods, mischief, identity theft, and some frauds.

Statutes & Acts Includes provincial statutes, primarily the Mental Health Act, Landlord Tenant Act and Trespass to property offences. It also includes custody dispute calls.


Traffic Includes motor vehicle collisions of all severities (property damage, personal injury and fatalities) and road rage incidents reported to police.

Violent Crimes The majority of offences counted in the Violent Crimes group are crimes against persons. This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Violent Crimes'. These include homicides, attempted murders, assaults, threats and robberies.



Community Safety /Media Relations

November and December 2021

Objectives of the CSO/Media Relations

- Distribute media releases in relation to the BIG4 corporately driven driving behaviours; impaired driving, aggressive driving, distracted driving and lack of seatbelt use.
- Seek community involvement by utilizing media releases with regard to property crimes such as break and enter, theft, mischief, drugs and wanted persons; with proven success.
- Prepare and distribute media releases in relation to major incidents throughout Lambton County.
- Work collaboratively with the Lambton Crime Unit, Community Street Crimes Unit, Operational Analyst and Sarnia-Lambton Crime Stoppers.
- Use social media to help promote upcoming OPP events
- Work closely with the Auxiliary Unit to assist in any upcoming events

NUMBER OF TARGETED MEDIA RELEASES:

A total of **8 media releases** were distributed for the month of **November**.

A total of **36 media releases** were distributed for the month of **December**.

PUBLIC EDUCATION CAMPAIGNS:

- A release and twitter post were created highlighting the Good Samaritans Drug Overdose Act and the importance of phoning in overdoses.
- A post was created regarding pedestrian safety after a complaint was received regarding pedestrians not being visible on roadways.
- In December, multiple posts were added along with radio interviews regarding the OPP Festive RIDE season and impaired driving.
- As inclement weather moved into the area on Dec 23, a post was added reminding motorists to drive with caution. Local radio stations were also notified and requested to broadcast same.

OTHER NEWS:

- Lambton OPP responded to a suspicious package at NOVA Chemicals. The CSO attended the command center and was designated as the main point of contact for all media inquiries.
- A release was posted after an OPP vehicle was struck on Highway 402 while investigating a separate collision.
- The Lambton CSO conducted multiple radio interviews with local media outlets regarding the holidays and the OPP Festive RIDE season.
- Lambton OPP attended the Bluewater Bridge after an American citizen crossed with a loaded stolen firearm. A media release was drafted with assistance from CBSA media personnel.
- A social media post was added, congratulating Lambton OPP's newest auxiliaries after their graduation in Orillia.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS OVERVIEW

NOVEMBER/DECEMBER 2021

The SRO continued foot and vehicle patrols inside and outside of both county secondary schools during November and December. Emphasis was placed on driving issues during the lunch periods and end of school when most driving complaints are reported.

The SRO also continued presenting in class sessions to both secondary schools with subjects including: Law, Drug abuse, Youth bullying, social media awareness and safety.

The School Resource Officer assisted many of the counties primary grade schools as well during this period in regards to youth bullying issues and social media awareness discussions.

November 2021

Petrolia – A male youth that does not attend the Petrolia High School continually attends the property. The male youth has been spoken to by staff members several times but continually re-attends. Police served a trespass notice to youth as well as a Provincial offence notice.

Corunna – A male youth was found to have committed a break and enter into a building and stole tools. The Lambton K9 unit was deployed and the youth was located. The youth was arrested and diverted to the Lambton Rebound program.

Forest - A youth was walking alone during the school lunch hour when he was approached by several other youths. One male youth struck the lone youth several times causing a minor head injury and his cell phone to be damaged. The suspect youth was diverted to Sarnia Lambton Rebound and the cell phone was replaced.

Corunna - A youth was found breaching their probation order.

There were 2 occurrences in the month of November with youth and suicidal thoughts and or attempts

There were 4 motor vehicle collisions during the Month of November involving 17 year old youths.

December 2021

Lambton County – Two female youths were being harassed by several youths. Due to the nature of the threats four female youths ages 14 to 16 have been charged with uttering threats and will appear before a criminal court.

Petrolia – A male youth was caught shoplifting from a local store. The youth was diverted to the Sarnia Lambton Rebound program.

St Clair Township – Three youths were found to be making threats to their teacher. The youths were spoken to by police and diverted to the Sarnia Lambton Rebound program.

Several assaults/fights occurred in or around Lambton county schools during the months of November and December.

Several youths ages 16 and 17 were charged under the Highway traffic Act for infractions during both months of November and December.

There were 2 occurrences in the month of December with youth and suicidal thoughts and or attempts

There were 2 motor vehicle collisions during the Month of December involving 17 year old youths.

- Crime Unit preparing disclosure for baby death in Courtright, mother and father both arrested and charged with manslaughter in relation to their babies death
- Crime Unit constantly involved in Overdose deaths which are ongoing
- Four reported sexual assaults reported with charges laid in two of them. One indecent act investigated
- Members of the Lambton County Crime Unit continue to investigate a Homicide on the Kettle & Stoney Point First Nation. The accused in this matter remains in custody
- Lambton had three sudden death in November
- Nine Criminal Harassment investigation

December 2021

- Lambton Crime investigating a double murder as a result of a suspicious person call in Oil Springs. One Male arrested and charged with two counts of second degree murder
- Lambton had six sudden death in December 2021
- Three Sexual Assaults reported with charges laid in two
- Preliminary hearing began for first degree murder in Corunna Domestic Homicide
- Lambton Crime Members investigating opioid overdose deaths - Ongoing. Fentanyl overdoses continue to be a challenge within the County of Lambton
- Walpole Island still in a state of emergency in relation to Fentanyl overdoses
- Lambton had three sudden deaths in December
- Major Fraud scams continue to be a trend for Lambton County. A media release was completed once again to warn members of the public of phone scams

COMMUNITY STREET CRIME UNIT:

- During the months of November & December 2021 Lambton CSCU investigated 15 occurrences
- Lambton CSCU members laid a total of 34 charges
- Lambton CSCU wrote 5 warrants, all for drug investigations, the unit completed 5 warrant service entries
- Lambton CSCU executed a S.11 CDSA Search Warrant on Walpole Island in relation to the State of Emergency issued by Walpole Island First Nation. Persons arrested: 4 – Charges: 8 and seized 3.9 grams of Fentanyl, small amount of Methamphetamine and Hydromorphone, \$4460 cash, drug trafficking paraphernalia
- Lambton CSCU executed a S.11 CDSA Search Warrant in Chatham-Kent in relation to the State of Emergency issued by Walpole Island First Nation. The location is just off Walpole Island where investigators were able to establish a high number of Walpole Island residents attending to purchase controlled substances. Persons arrested: 4 – Charges: 4 and seized 20 grams of Fentanyl and drug trafficking paraphernalia
- Lambton CSCU executed a S.11 CDSA Search Warrant on Walpole Island in relation to the State of Emergency issued by Walpole Island First Nation. Persons arrested: 2 – Charges: 22 and seized 2 grams of Fentanyl, small amount of Cocaine and Methamphetamine, \$425 cash, drug paraphernalia, and a prohibited firearm (sawed off shotgun) was located
- Lambton CSCU assisted Elgin-Middlesex CSCU with a warrant entry and surveillance
- Lambton CSCU assisted Organized Crime Enforcement Bureau with a warrant service entry related to Project Gainsborough
- Lambton CSCU continues to assist Walpole Island Police Service with intelligence gathering related to drug trafficking pertaining to the State of Emergency issued as a result of the high number of opioid drug related overdoses
- Drug Overdose occurrences continue to be a concern in Lambton County and across the Province. Lambton CSCU will conduct follow up with users who have overdosed to offer them help and assistance
- Currently CSCU members continue to be a part of one CIB drug overdose death investigation that is ongoing in addition to the other overdose investigations
- Lambton CSCU continues to offer support to frontline policing operations by taking samples of seized drugs and sending the samples to Health Canada for analysis
- Lambton CSCU organized the Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Campaign to raise awareness of this legislation

CITIZENS SELF REPORTING:

You have the option to report select occurrences to the OPP from your computer or mobile device using the OPP's Citizen Self Reporting system.

Use this system to report:

1. Lost/missing property under \$5,000
2. Stolen license plates or validation stickers
3. Theft from a vehicle under \$5,000
4. Mischief/damage to a vehicle under \$5,000
5. Mischief/damage to property (other than a vehicle) under \$5,000
6. Theft under \$5,000
7. Driving Complaint

FRONTLINE SUPPORT UNIT (FSU):

The Frontline Support Unit (FSU) program is a differential response strategy that focuses on call management. This includes responsibility for the OPP's Citizen Self-Reporting (CSR) system which is an online police reporting system for members of the public to report specific occurrences directly to the OPP via the Internet. The FSU model will offer a call handling alternative for select calls for service allowing the deployment of resources to critical incidents or member engagement in proactive police activities. Through the use of technology, the OPP continues to improve our processes and service delivery in support of its vision.
